Last Meeting

Gary Evarts presented a program on inside-out turning. Inside-out or, involuted, turning is a two-stage process of combining identical sized staves (blocks of wood), affixing them together temporarily, thus allowing the first sage to be turned, after which the staves are disassembled, rearranged, and turned again. In other words, there are two turnings: one to create the inside shape and a second turning for the outside shape.

Turning process:

For the first turning the glue up/clamping is temporary. Numerous methods can be employed to accomplish this such as, wood glue with paper and strapping tape, super glue and strapping tape, hot glue (high temp glue best, remove with denatured alcohol) and strapping tape, hose clamps and colored masking tape to cover the edges of the clamp for safety measures, jam chuck, and screws. The number of staves or blanks per project can be from two to as many as you want with four being the best number to start with.



Gary recommends if using a 1 inch stave, the pattern be no more than 7/8th inches deep. This would allow a 1/4th inch glue up at the smallest part of the first turning and allow easier separation of the blanks for regluing for the final

shaping of the object in the second turning. It may be a good idea to remove the center pin in the live center and use the cup center to avoid splitting the blanks apart during the final turning. A paper pattern such as a heart or star folded over a corner to give a guide to the area to be removed in the first turning will be a big help. Care must be taken when doing the second turning not to go too deep or the whole thing will explode and you will get to start over. Gary noted that the grain of the blanks should all be going the same way and to start with an easy design.
