

Captive rings are turned with either home-made tools or commercially-made tools. Some photos show each:




Home tools made from Allen wrenches and two commercially made tools for turning captive rings





After turning your project round, plunge your parting tool into the work about 5/8 inch deep, and clear out some working room around your planned ring.

Elsewhere in the newsletter is info about Turn On Chicago, a three-day immersion into turning with world-class demonstrators.


The Marion Arts Festival is scheduled for May 21, with a return of the empty bowls project. Our club is participating, as in past years, by donating bowls that we have turned to be sold to the public. All proceeds will be divided between the Churches of Marion Food Pantry, Linn Community Food Bank, and Willis Dady Homeless Services. There will also be ceramic bowls for sale made by local schoolkids. As an incentive to our club members, the board has purchased several bowl blanks from Johnson Wood Products that we will hand out to our members. The bowl blanks are to be used exclusively for this project. If you take a blank, we'll have you sign that you took one. Finish undercutting the ring until it is free from the spindle. You can sand the inside of the ring by wrapping a strip of sandpaper around the spindle and hold the ring against the spinning sandpaper. Go on to complete your project.

Turn-On Chicago is Back!

A note from Al Miotke Chairperson, Turn-On Chicago.

Turn On! Chicago is a biennial regional symposium hosted by the Chicago Woodturners in the northern Chicago Suburb of Northbrook.

We have a fantastic line-up of demonstrators including Beth Ireland, Cynthia Carden, Andy Cole, Jacques Vesery, Avelino Samuel, Eric Lofstrom, Keith Lackner, Roberto Ferrer, Clint Stevens, Marie Anderson, and Rob Wallace.

These are world class woodturners all within just a few hours of home. Three days of total immersion into woodturning includes 50 rotations, an instant gallery, a vendor area, banquet, auction of wood art, tools and supplies and even a peoples choice award from the items in the instant gallery. There will be a hands on pens for troops event, women in turning meeting, and we will be collecting beads of courage boxes to benefit Chicago's Lurie Children's Hospital. This is a great value at just \$265 (including Saturday banquet) and new this year we are including special youth pricing (for those under 21) of just \$40 (not including banquet). The location of the event has changed this year. The symposium is being held at the Crowne Plaza- Northbrook Hotel and Convention Center. This is a newly renovated facility with an attached hotel so everything is under one roof. It is also easy to get too and is close to interstate highway 294 in Northbrook, Illinois. Dues Structure and Meeting Attendance Policy

Club dues are:

\$25.00 per year for an General membership. \$30.00 per year for a Family membership. \$100.00 per year for a Supporting membership.
