Last Meeting

Last month Joe Lesko led a discussion on turning with the new turners in mind. Joe discussed safety issues involving lathe use as well as the different lathe tools and their differences and use. One of the major things noted was if you are going to make a cut and you don't feel comfortable doing it, **Stop** and think abut it for a moment. Try the cut with the lathe stopped and turned by hand. This can be a very helpful technique after an unexpected catch. If you try the same thing over and expect a different result you will get the same catch. Slow down, think, and try to understand why it happened and remedy the situation before you continue.

Turning Session May

We will have a hands on turning session on **May, 11** from 8:00AM or so until about 3:00 PM . This is open to all the members and will be held at the shop of Tom and Stacy Nehl. They live at 1008 Rolling Glen Drive in Marion. This is the second street to the right, past Linn Mar High School on North 10th St.

Bring your own tools, and face shield or eye protection, and questions. If you have some wood of your own you would like to turn bring that as well. There will be 5 or 6 lathes set up for actual practice time and plenty of members to help with questions. The club will provide something for lunch, Stacy has hinted she will make some pulled pork for sandwiches, and there will be pop and water to drink.




