Last Meeting

Last month Stacy Nehl demonstrated the making of a "Sunset" bowl. Stacy started with a large shallow platter with a wide rim and used several coarse carving burs to rough up the rim area. No particular pattern, just rough it up and then lightly sand off the fuzzies. She then used masking tape to mask off the center of the platter and used black spray paint to paint the rim being careful to get paint into all the carved areas. Several coats may be necessary get full coverage. While the paint dried she turned a round feature for the center of the platter and roughed it up and painted it black similar to the platters edge. With the paint dry and the masking tape removed she used a bowl gouge to make a sharp clean edge from the inner edge of the rim to the center of the platter. Using an airbrush she blended this center area of the platter with blue and green paint. Any color or mix of colors could be used depending on the artists particular wish. With all the paint dry a silver burnishing cream was lightly rubbed over the roughened rim and center feature to add highlights to those areas. The center feature was glued in the center of the platter and a spray of clear poly was applied to the finished platter. The bottom was not painted but finished as natural wood.



This style of platter will be the Project of the Month for September.
